

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

<p>Who is eligible for the Advantage Tuition Grant?</p>	<p>All current part- and full-time employees at the Trilogy Home Office, Trilogy campuses, Paragon, and PCA are eligible after 6 months of employment.</p>
<p>I am an eligible employee. What do I need to do to ensure my classes are paid for?</p>	<p>You will need to begin the enrollment process through Purdue Global. You can access their site by visiting www.TheTrilogyFoundation.org/purdue. You will need to click on the box labeled "Learn More About Purdue Global" and then begin the admissions and enrollment process.</p>
<p>Are textbooks covered?</p>	<p>Textbooks are included with undergraduate programs; graduate students are responsible for the cost of textbooks.</p>
<p>Can I earn credit for my prior college courses?</p>	<p>If you have any prior credits or degrees, inform your Admissions Advisor when you speak to them about locating and sending transcripts. They will help you find the transcripts and determine if you can transfer the credits.</p>
<p>What if my employment status changes mid-degree?</p>	<p>If you switch employers during an academic term, that term is still covered. However, any subsequent terms will not be covered by Trilogy.</p>
<p>What if I fail a course or decide mid-degree to stop?</p>	<p>Trilogy allows one fail/drop under its tuition assistance program. Any additional fails/drops would remove your eligibility for Trilogy tuition assistance.</p> <p><small>You can try an undergraduate program for 3 weeks without any obligation. Classes count toward a degree if satisfactorily completed. No credits are earned if the student withdraws during the introductory period (3 weeks for new qualifying undergraduate students), which begins day one of the first term. Students who choose to continue their studies at Purdue Global will need to meet specific requirements. Graduate programs not included. Additional terms may apply to international and non-U.S. citizen students. For further information, see the University Catalog.</small></p>

What is the time commitment?	Each course is 4, 5, or 6 credit hours. Undergraduate programs total 180 credit hours, and it is suggested that you take 1 to 2 courses per term. Graduate programs vary from 56 to 76 total credit hours and some allow you to take only 1 course per term. The estimated time spent studying is 15 to 18 hours per week per course for undergraduate programs and 20 to 25 hours per week per course for graduate programs.
How do I enroll?	You will need to begin the enrollment process through Purdue Global. You can access their site by visiting www.TheTrilogyFoundation.org/purdue . You will need to click on the box labeled "Learn More About Purdue Global" and then begin the admissions and enrollment process. You can call or live chat with an Admissions Advisor, or complete the request info form and an Advisor will reach out to you with next steps.
When can I start?	Employees can enroll between January and July. Anyone taking classes during that time, can continue classes through the end of the calendar year. Those that are new to the program may not begin taking classes during the months of August-December. A maximum of 500 employees will be enrolled under this partnership at any given time.
I have been prompted to pay some fees during the enrollment process. Does Trilogy cover these fees?	Trilogy covers the tuition for your degree. They do, however, require participants to commit to \$25/week (taken out via payroll deduction). Once accepted in to the Purdue Global education program, participants must complete the Opt-In form (https://trilogy.tfaforms.net/4858426) prior to starting classes. Other fees, such as the background check that are required for certain programs, will be your responsibility.
I've been asked to complete a Student Records Release Form. What is this and why do I need to complete it?	This document allows the Trilogy team to see your grades each term. This is part of our agreement in funding your full tuition. There are no minimum grades required by Trilogy; you must, however, be in compliance with the Purdue Global Standard Academic Progress policy. Simply put, we want to help you succeed in the program. Our goal is to reach out to you if you are struggling and see if there's any way we can support you. All Students in the Trilogy/Purdue Global partnership must complete this form prior to beginning classes.
